On May 16 (Historic Preservation Month), the La Crosse County Historical Society took a bus tour of the northern reaches of La Crosse County. They stopped by the Bridges on the first day that I noted any mosquitoes.

The interesting side note is that when the bus came to the end of Old Highway 93, it turned left, and not right. We could certainly use a sign there directing folks to the Bridges. The poor bus had nowhere to turn around until it traveled for a few minutes back south. We could have had a bit longer to talk about our history, but what we did have, was a delight.

## Spreading the Word

On May 23<sup>rd</sup> Nancy Hill and Linda McMullin made an hour-long PowerPoint presentation at the **Onalaska Library community room**. The presentation consisted of two parts.

- The first part focused on the history of McGilvray Road and the Bridges, starting with Alex McGilvray's arrival and ending in 1989. At that time the road was closed and the bridges were in such bad repair that there was a WI State proposal to remove all but one of them.
- The second part of the history began with the rally to save the bridges and the formation of the "Friends." The information covered all of the improvements made to the trail and the Bridges, and a review of the tremendous amount of funds and effort contributed by many people over the last 30 years.

Nancy and Linda repeated the same presentation a couple of weeks later to the **Brice Prairie Conservation Club**.

A short history presentation was also given to the **Holmen Garden Club** on August 21, followed by a tour of the bridges and trail with several of the members. It was a lovely day and many wildflowers were out.

The hour-long PowerPoint McGilvray history presentation will be given again on May 1, 2019 to the **Holmen Area Historical Society** at the Holmen Village Hall at 7 pm.

## McGilvray Visit

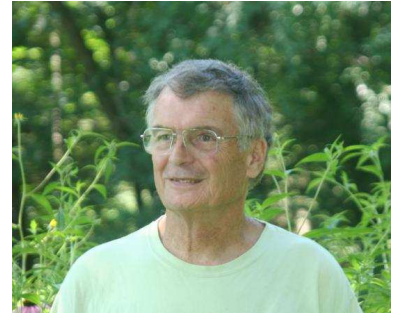
