Conclusions:

1. This list of breeding and migrant birds is incomplete. Note absence of mallard and American robin.
2. Uncommon birds marked "U" (3).
3. Rare birds marked "R" (1).
4. Birds seen three years, considered special to the area, marked "S".
5. Species whose population is limited or uncertain "T" (1).
6. The McGilvray Bridges area is a good location to search for woodland and wetland species of birds, and for migrant warblers.
